### CAMPUS SETTING

The Academy has been established in its current location in Carlsbad, CA since 1936. It is about 35 miles north of San Diego and about 80 miles south of Los Angeles. The campus consists of 29 buildings on 16.5 acres, including a gymnasium, cafeteria, library media center, eight classroom buildings, recreation center, chapel, nine dormitories, six eight-man cottages, and four staff houses. In addition, the campus contains administrative offices, a swimming pool, tennis courts, athletic field, private beachfront, and a rifle range. The Academy owns all its property by virtue of a bequest from a benefactor who willed the land with a conditional use stipulation that the Academy operate as a non-profit institution governed by a board of trustees.

### MISSION VALUES

Our mission is to educate and develop young men of good character to lead lives of service and excellence.

The Army and Navy Academy will be a premier, internationally recognized boarding school for young men and will be known for its academic excellence. The Academy's military foundation will enable its cadets to develop leadership skills and character traits necessary to succeed in life.

Our philosophy advances the fulfillment of our mission and provides a pathway for cadets to: Gain respect for country, love of God, and devotion to all for which they stand; Appreciate education and the realization of individual potential; Maintain personal honor and a sense of pride in themselves; Develop discipline, leadership qualities, and respect for others.

### ACCREDITATION

The Army and Navy Academy is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) which is recognized by the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS), and the California Association of Independent Schools (CAIS).

### AFFILIATION

The Army and Navy Academy is a member of The Association of Boarding Schools (TABS), the Association of Military Colleges and Schools of the United States (AMCSUS), the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS), and the California Association of Independent Schools (CAIS). The U.S. Army JROTC Program, as a result of our performance in the Annual Federal Inspection, also recognizes ANA as an Honor Unit with Distinction.

### STUDENT BODY

*States represented:* 13, primarily California, Arizona, Nevada, Oregon, and Washington. *Countries represented:* 13, including Korea, Japan, Russia, China, Taiwan, and Indonesia.

### FACULTY

There are 34 full-time and 4 part-time faculty members, 47% of whom have Master's degree or higher, 61% of whom hold a teaching credential. The faculty represent more than 400 years combined teaching experience.

### CURRICULUM

Since its inception in 1910, Army and Navy Academy has sought to develop scholarship and honorable character in young men. In order to achieve these ends, it is essential that the academic curriculum be appropriately demanding and stress the attributes of good citizenship. The grade level requirements are designed to put cadets on the path for eligibility to the University of California system.

*Advanced Placement (AP) courses* include Art, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, English, French, Modern European History, Physics B, Psychology, Spanish, and United States History.

### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Below are the Army and Navy Academy graduation requirements for cadets entering in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade. Cadets entering in 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grade must take 6 courses per semester and must meet all requirements, except for grade-specific courses taken prior to their entrance to ANA. Because Army and Navy Academy aligns itself with the requirements for entry into the University of California system, we require that *both D's and F's* in core academic subjects be remediated to passing grades (C or above) through attending summer programs, retaking the class at ANA, or taking Academy-approved independent study classes.

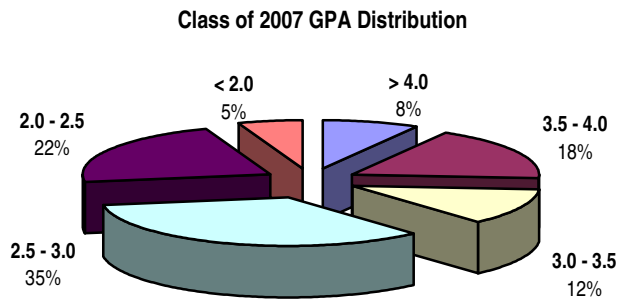
The Army and Navy Academy uses the standard Carnegie Unit and Student Hour guidelines. When the term "unit" is used it refers to Carnegie Unit. The Carnegie Unit and Student Hour (also called Credit Hour) are strictly time-based references for measuring educational attainment used by American universities and colleges.

The following graduation requirements are organized according to the University of California standards of the A-C course offerings.

- A – History / Social Science**..... 3 ½ units  
Including Geography, World History, U.S. History, Economics (½ unit), and U.S. Government (½ unit).
- B – English**..... 4 units
- C – Mathematics**.....3 units (through Algebra II)
- D – Laboratory Science**..... 2 units (including Biology)
- E – Language Other Than English**.....2 units
- F – Visual and Performing Arts**.....1 unit
- G – Elective**.....4 units
- Leadership Education and Training (JROTC)**..... 2 units (½ unit per year)
- Physical Education**..... 2 units
- PSAT Prep**..... ½ unit

## GPA INFORMATION

Both transferred grades and grades earned by cadets at the Army and Navy Academy are used to calculate cumulative GPA. Honors and Advanced Placement (AP) courses are weighted one grade point higher than the grade earned for the course.

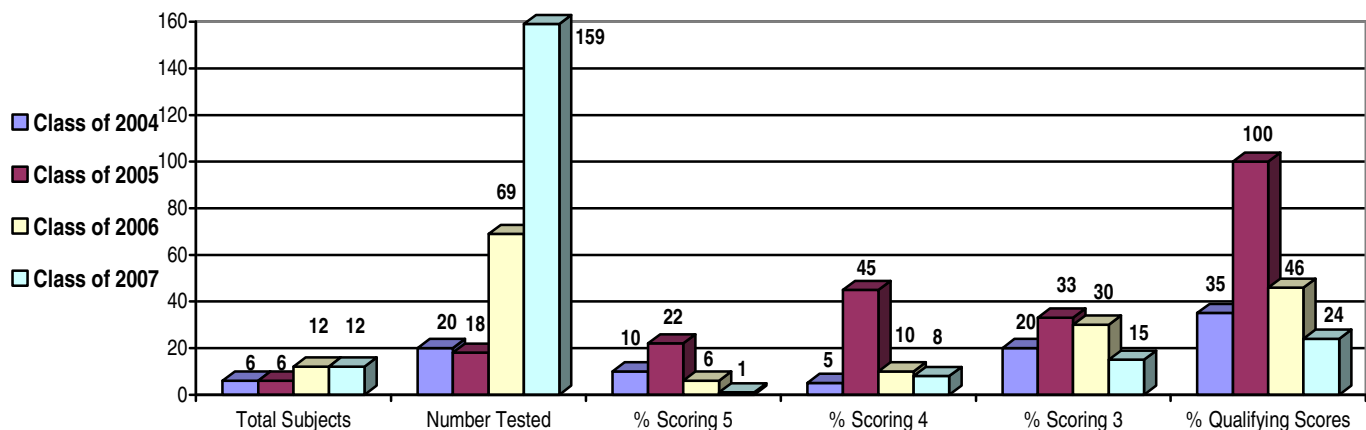
Weighted four-point average:
