**TECHRADIUM'S 'IRIS' ALERT SYSTEM SUCCESSFULLY USED
AS MILITARY SCHOOL CLOSES IN CALIFORNIA FIRE THREAT**

SAN DIEGO, California, October 31, 2007 – Students and faculty at a leading military school were safely evacuated after receiving instant notice by IRIS – Immediate Response Information System – during the fires that raged through Southern California this past week.

The Army and Navy Academy in nearby Carlsbad, California, was ordered closed by Brig. Gen. Steven Bliss. The academy's staff used IRIS, the patented mass notification system of TechRadium, Inc., of Sugar Land, Texas, to send the message

More than 1,500 students, parents and faculty were notified immediately of the decision to close the school. The patented IRIS system also permits the user to know simultaneously just who received or did not receive the notification.

“In closing the school, Gen. Bliss cited a number of health and safety concerns stemming from the wildfires,” the Academy said in a statement. Although the Academy was in no danger from the fires themselves, air quality in Carlsbad was poor and California utilities had warned of possible power outages. State government officials had urged all residents of San Diego and the surrounding area to remain in their homes.

Cadets were told to return to the campus by Sunday and classes resumed on Monday, October 28.

“This is another example of how our IRIS system is successfully used in emergency and non-emergency situations,” said Ryan Rodkey, chief executive officer of TechRadium.

The IRIS system is widely used across the U.S. in schools, businesses, government offices and other locations. The system can send alert messages to thousands of recipients in 30 seconds “with the click of a single mouse,” Mr. Rodkey said.
