AN UPDATE FROM THE DEAN OF ACADEMICS

Dear Warrior Families,

First, I wanted to thank all of the families who were able to join us for conferences last week! Our teachers, counselors and TAC officers truly enjoyed connecting with you about your Cadet.

As we move into week three of Remote Learning and the final week of the grading period, many Cadets are starting to find a rhythm and have established a daily schedule to help them balance academics, exercise, and free time. Remote Learning is new to all of us, and we realize that at times some Cadets can feel overwhelmed. We will continue to do our utmost to support our amazing Cadets.

I have included some important information for you to review below:

1. **Friday, April 10th through Monday, April 13th are holidays for faculty, staff and Cadets.** These holidays were already part of the regular school year Easter schedule.
2. **The end of Grading Period Five is this Friday, April 10th.** Since this is Easter Holiday Weekend, teachers and counselors will not be available for live support. Cadets should be actively seeking assistance and support from their teachers this week and should avoid waiting until Friday to contact them. Teachers will be accepting work until 4pm on Friday.
3. If you are missing any work, ensure all assignments are submitted no later than 4pm on Friday in order for it to count towards your GP 5 grade. If you need live support, contact your teacher.
4. **Grading Period Six will officially begin on Tuesday, April 14th.**
5. The Counseling Department will be sending specific information to each grade level family over the next few weeks. Families of current 11th grade Cadets can expect detailed information about the college planning process.
6. Recently we have heard some suggestions concerning holding live classroom sessions. As an international boarding school, we have Cadets from many different states and countries which creates many challenges for live classes. Further, many of our teachers and counselors are also caring for family

members and children at home, and thus their schedules must remain flexible. However, we will continue to offer scheduled live support for all Cadets.

7. Some Cadets are still struggling to create and maintain a structured daily schedule. Due to this, I have asked our Counselors to post two different daily schedules in their Google Classrooms. These schedules include two options for Cadets to reference as a guide to help better structure their days and nights.
8. We will be sending out important information concerning AP Exams and Final Exams soon.
